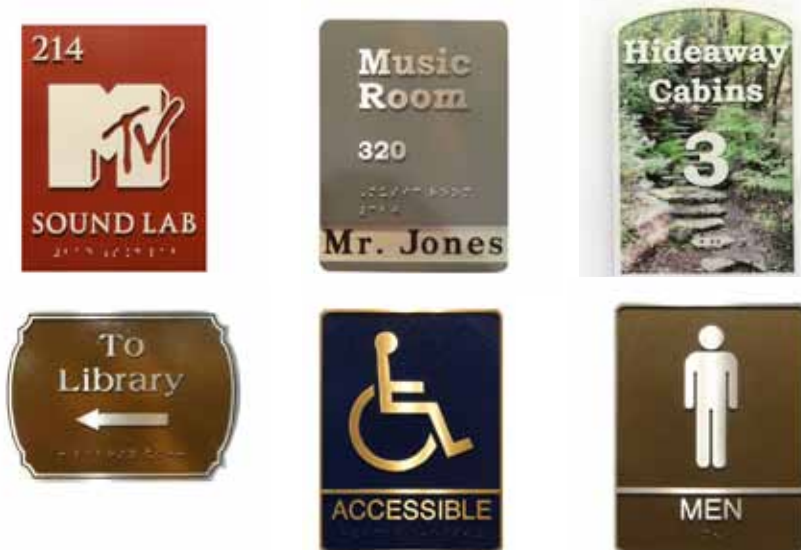

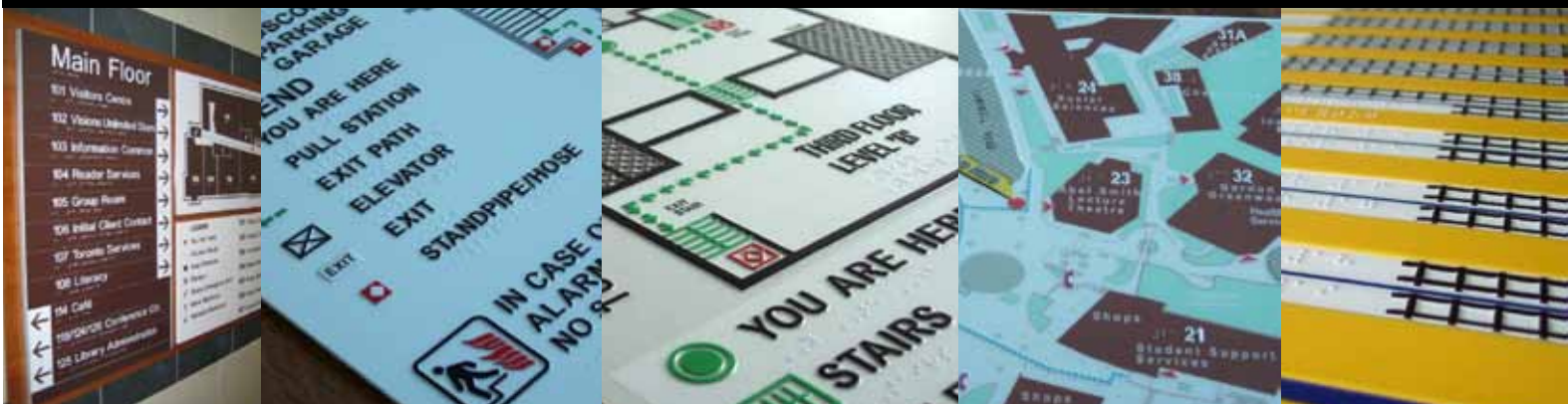

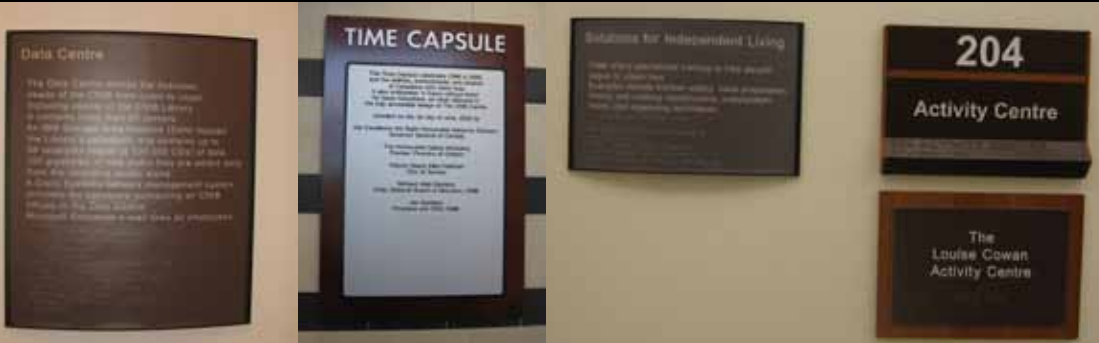

The AODA was passed in 2005 with its main goal to make Ontario accessible for people with disabilities by 2025. The AODA is built on the premise of the American Disability Act (ADA). In America, as of March 12, 2012 all public buildings must have large print and Braille signage. Public access buildings include: restaurants, hotels and educational facilities. The accessibility standard for the Built Environment will help remove barriers in buildings and outdoor spaces for people with disabilities.

Our work is currently in demand, given the fact that the Ministry of Community and Social Services is phasing in five accessibility standards between 2011 and 2025. The standards, set out under the AODA are the rules that businesses and organizations in Ontario will have to follow to identify, remove and prevent barriers to accessibility.

Improved accessibility of buildings is becoming more urgent in Ontario where 1.85 million Ontarians – 15 percent of the population – have disabilities. That number will increase in the coming years due to an aging population that may develop physical disabilities that will affect their mobility, their vision or their hearing. Making buildings in Ontario accessible by the governments goal of 2025 helps businesses set themselves apart from their competitors and builds goodwill among customers.
